## General information and level of education

- Number of residents (2016): 5.7 Million
- Age structure (2015): 0-24 years: 61 %/ 25-54 years: 31.5 %/ 55 and older: 7.5 %
- Residents aged 15-24 (2015): 1 million (approx. 111,000 persons per age cohort)
- ➤ Illiteracy rate (2016): 35 % of the persons older than 15 years
- > Enrolled in school (2015): 38.95 % of an age cohort
- > Proportion of students in secondary education (2015): 36 % of an age cohort
- > Proportion of government-run vocational education (2015): 0.57 % of an age cohort
- ➤ Proportion with academic qualifications (2015): approx. 2.56 % of an age cohort
- Languages: Tigrinya, Arabic, English, as well as the languages of the new ethnic tribes

## **Immigration and integration in Germany**

- > Immigration in 2016: 12,291 registrations
- > Asylum applications in 2016: 19,103 applications
- Protected status in 2016: 92.2 %, with adjusted protected status: 98.9 % %
- > Eritrean population in 2016: 59,800
- Fritrean employees with social security insurance benefits in 2016: 3,520 (2015: 2,888)
- Eritrean job seekers in 2016: 22,240 (2015: 7,906)
- ➤ The most frequent professions in the recognition process: (4/2012 12/2015): nurse, automotive mechatronics (so far only a few applications)

## **Education system**

- ➤ **History**: among others, British influence on the educational system; even today, beginning with the intermediate level (grade 6) the lessons are delivered in English
- > Structure: centralised education system
- ➤ Government-run vocational training programmes: Initial training in the fields of agriculture, crafts, technology, industry and medicine; Requirement: passing of the national placement examination after eight years of compulsory schooling ("National Examination Certificates"), duration: 2-3 years; then joint graduation class in the Military Camp Sawa, followed by post-secondary vocational training, duration: 1-2 years
- Number of vocational education options: among others, 19 craft and technical training courses at the government-run training centre in Sawa
- Non-governmental vocational training programmes: There are non-formal training opportunities, especially for women and minorities (e.g. through the National Union of Eritrean Youth and Students (NUEYS)); traditional employer-intern vocational training ("learning by doing it"), especially in the craft and agricultural sectors
